CONDUCT OF THE CY 2018 1st QUARTER NATIONWIDE SIMULTANEOUS EARTHQUAKE DRILL (NSED)

1. Attached is NDRRMC Memorandum No. 17 s. 2018 re "CONDUCT OF THE CY 2018 QUARTERLY NATIONWIDE SIMULATANEOUS EARTHQUAKE DRILL (NSED)", the content of which is self-explanatory.
2. Anent this, all elementary and secondary schools, both public and private, are directed to conduct a **Nationwide Simultaneous Earthquake Drill (NSED) on February 15, 2018 at exactly 2:00 PM.**
3. Herewith is the list of things to do in preparation for the earthquake drill:
 - Connect with Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (LDRRMC) for an orientation on earthquake to understand intensity and possible impacts. Discuss preparedness measures.
 - Map out personnel/learners and contact numbers.
 - Determine communication flow among offices/schools and overall command system.
 - Determine personnel/learners with special needs in case of an earthquake; assign focal persons within the particular office/classroom to take charge of those personnel/learner with special needs.
 - Put up signages for evacuation routes and safe places to gather and/or evacuate to.
 - Ensure that everyone knows what to do during and after an earthquake.
 - Conduct post evaluation of the drill.
4. Evaluation forms will be submitted by respective schools to the District Office for consolidation, a day after the conduct of the NSED. District consolidated reports should be submitted to the Division Office on or before ~~February~~ **February 18, 2018** through the online form at **<http://deped.in/NSEDnegor>** or **<https://goo.gl/9gxCLn>**

Rule 6, Section 7 of the Implementing Rules and Regulations of the RA 10121 states that "Public awareness shall also be undertaken through the conduct of drills by the LDRRMO on a regular basis". Likewise, the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Plan (NDRRMP) states that one of the activities to achieve Outcome 10: "Developed and implemented comprehensive national and local preparedness and response policies, plans and systems" is to develop/ enhance and simulate scenario-based preparedness and response plans. Furthermore, one of the policy framework stated in the National Disaster Preparedness Plan as embedded in the fourth priority area of the Sendai Framework for Action 2015 – 2030 includes the target: "to promote regular disaster preparedness, response and recovery exercises".

In view hereof, the schedule for the CY 2018 Quarterly Nationwide Simultaneous Earthquake Drill (NSED) is hereby disseminated:

1 st Quarter	15 February 2018
2 nd Quarter	10 May 2018
3 rd Quarter	16 August 2018
4 th Quarter	15 November 2018

The first quarter NSED ceremonial venue will be in **Quezon City** and will commence at **1400H**. Actual location and other details are to be determined based on the results of the coordination meetings of the OCD with relevant stakeholders.

The objectives are as follows:


1. To test the efficiency and usefulness of the preparedness, response and recovery plans, systems and policies developed in their respective localities/ offices/ schools;
2. To evaluate the effectiveness of contingency plan;
3. To test the coordination and communication mechanism during response operation.
4. To understand the command and control mechanism in emergency and disaster operation at the DRRMCs.

All NDRRMC member agencies, Metro Manila RDRRMC member agencies, and Regional Chairpersons of all RDRRMCs are enjoined to spearhead the conduct of earthquake drill in their areas of jurisdiction.

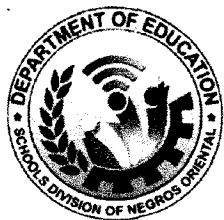

It was participated by the pupils, students, teaching & non-teaching personnel, and stakeholders. Below is the consolidated report of 34 District Offices of our Division.

Problems Encountered

The following problems were encountered during the activity:

- Bad weather condition during the conduct of NSED;
- Some teachers and non-teaching were not participating during the conduct of the drill;
- The number of Government agencies to be tapped during this activity can't cater the number of schools in the district;
- Some Brgy. Officials have no idea on how to conduct the NSED properly;
- Classes were suspended during the NSED
- No enough space for holding area in some schools;

General Recommendations

Based on the evaluation submitted from our district offices, here are the following recommendations:

- The number of Government agencies in the localities can't cater the needs of all schools in the districts, the activity (NSED) must not be simultaneously done but by schedule. The date, time, and partner agencies will be identified and scheduled by the district DRRM coordinators. It is best to invite resource persons from local DRRM and other government agencies to lecture on what to do before, during and after the earthquake to all learners, teachers and parents;
- Once a month conduct of NSED for students/pupils to be more prepared;
- Orientation video on how to conduct earthquake drill properly;
- Increase the level of awareness and participation with other stakeholders by involving more members of the community as they are also vulnerable to earthquake and disaster situation;
- Other government agencies should be informed also about the NSED. It is supposed to be simultaneous but other agencies were not conducting the drill;

- LDRRMC must orient Brgy. Officials on how to conduct NSED properly;
- Presence of Brgy. Tanods or Men in uniform for schools who used public roads as holding area;
- If possible, school can conduct drill any convenient time within the day.

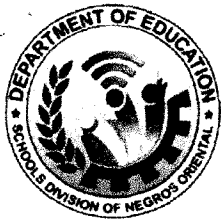
