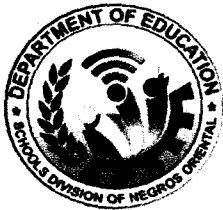
1. As per Regional Memorandum No. 813 s. 2018, all elementary and secondary schools, both public and private shall participate in the conduct of the **CY 2018 4th Quarter Nationwide Simultaneous Earthquake Drill (NSED) and Observance of World Tsunami Awareness Day**. The Fourth Quarter NSED will commence on November 5, 2018 at 8:00 AM (Monday).
2. Herewith is the list of things to do in preparation for the earthquake drill:
 - Connect with Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (LDRRMC) for an orientation on earthquake to understand intensity and possible impacts. Discuss preparedness measures.
 - Map out personnel/learners and contact numbers.
 - Determine communication flow among offices/schools and overall command system.
 - Determine personnel/learners with special needs in case of an earthquake; assign focal persons within the particular office/classroom to take charge of those personnel/learner with special needs.
 - Put up signages for evacuation routes and safe places to gather and/or evacuate to.
 - Ensure that everyone knows what to do during and after an earthquake.
 - Conduct post evaluation of the drill.
3. Evaluation forms (*see attached form*) will be submitted by respective schools to the District Office for consolidation, 3 days after the conduct of the NSED. District consolidated reports should be submitted to the Division Office on or before November 9, 2018 through the online form at <http://deped.in/NSEDnegor> or <https://goo.gl/9gxCLn>
4. Immediate and widest dissemination of the Memorandum to all concerned is hereby directed.

Problems Encountered

The following problems were encountered during the activity:

- Parents are reluctant to participate.;
- Some students ignored the safety precautions. Others went out from their classroom a little bit late;
- Learners are misbehaving during the drill but the teachers were able to cope with it;
- Lack of tools and equipment;
- Absence of well trained personnel;
- Lack of personnel from BFP and LDRRMC;
- Lack of proper preparation on the conduct of NSED resulted to few participants.
- Some government agencies did not participate in the drill;
- Miscommunication with the municipal fire marshal on giving signal to start the drill.

General Recommendations

Based on the evaluation submitted from our district offices, here are the following recommendations:

- It would be best if there are other members of stakeholder/parents attended the drill;
- Schools must have a hand held radios;
- Schools must be equipped with NSED materials e.g. megaphone and the like;
- The government must provide the necessary DRRM equipment;
- School DRRM coordinators need training on proper conduct of multi-hazard drills;
- Schools must follow the said deadline of submission of reports so that the district coordinators can also submit on time;
- First aid Training of School DRRM Coordinator;
- Include in the program the possible first aid in case of injury.

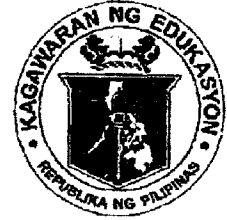

SUBJECT : CONDUCT OF THE CY 2018 4th QUARTER NATIONWIDE SIMULTANEOUS EARTHQUAKE DRILL (NSED) AND OBSERVANCE OF WORLD TSUNAMI AWARENESS DAY

Rule 6, Section 7 of the Implementing Rules and Regulations of the RA 10121 states that "Public awareness shall also be undertaken through the conduct of drills by the LDRRMO on a regular basis". Likewise, the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Plan (NDRRMP) states that one of the activities to achieve Outcome 10: "Developed and implemented comprehensive national and local preparedness and response policies, plans and systems" is to develop/ enhance and simulate scenario-based preparedness and response plans. Furthermore, one of the policy framework stated in the National Disaster Preparedness Plan as embedded in the fourth priority area of the Sendai Framework for Action 2015 – 2030 includes the target: "to promote regular disaster preparedness, response and recovery exercises".

The United Nations General Assembly through Resolution 70/203 called for the participation of its member states "to observe World Tsunami Awareness Day in an appropriate manner and in accordance with national priorities to raise public awareness of the risk caused by tsunamis"

In view hereof, the CY 2018 4th Quarter Nationwide Simultaneous Earthquake Drill (NSED) and Observance of World Tsunami Awareness Day is scheduled on **05 November 2018, 8:00 AM**. The National Ceremonial Venue will be at Pagadian City, Zamboanga Del Sur.

The objectives are as follows:

1. The 2018 World Tsunami Awareness Day will focus on Target (c) of the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2015-2030 which aims at reducing disaster-related economic losses in relation to global Gross Domestic Product by 2030.
2. To increase community awareness and knowledge on tsunami risks through the conduct of "Tsunami Run" for coastal areas.
3. To institutionalize preparedness measures in urban and/or coastal areas.
4. To establish Tsunami Early Warning Systems.
