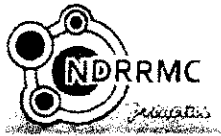
CY 2018 2nd QUARTER NATIONWIDE SIMULTANEOUS EARTHQUAKE DRILL (NSED)

1. In reference to **NDRRMC Memorandum No. 31 s. 2018 re "RESCHEDULING OF THE CONDUCT CY 2018 QUARTERLY NATIONWIDE SIMULATANEOUS EARTHQUAKE DRILL (NSED)"**, the content of which is self-explanatory.
2. With this, all elementary and secondary schools, both public and private, are directed to conduct a **Nationwide Simultaneous Earthquake Drill (NSED) on June 21, 2018 at exactly 2:00 PM.**
3. Herewith is the list of things to do in preparation for the earthquake drill:
 - Connect with Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (LDRRMC) for an orientation on earthquake to understand intensity and possible impacts. Discuss preparedness measures.
 - Map out personnel/learners and contact numbers.
 - Determine communication flow among offices/schools and overall command system.
 - Determine personnel/learners with special needs in case of an earthquake; assign focal persons within the particular office/classroom to take charge of those personnel/learner with special needs.
 - Put up signages for evacuation routes and safe places to gather and/or evacuate to.
 - Ensure that everyone knows what to do during and after an earthquake.
 - Conduct post evaluation of the drill.
4. Evaluation forms (*see attached form*) will be submitted by respective schools to the District Office for consolidation, 3 days after the conduct of the NSED. District consolidated reports should be submitted to the Division Office on or before June 30, 2018 through the online form at <http://deped.in/NSEDnegor> or <https://goo.gl/9gxCLn>

COMELEC Resolution No. 10213 dated 24 October 2017. Rules and Regulations Implementing Republic Act No. 10952 Entitled. An Act Postponing the October 2017 Barangay and Sangguniang Kabataan Elections. Problems Encountered

The following problems were encountered during the activity:

- Some pupils and teachers were not present during the drill due to other activities in line with National Festival of Talents (NFOT) held in Dumaguete City, Negros Oriental;
- Less number of participants due to heavy rain and thunderstorms.
- Lack of medicine kit in every classroom;
- Insufficient ground space for Holding Area;
- No budget for the implementation of the activity;
- Sirens can't be heard from a distant classroom;
- Availability of LDRRMC, BFP and other government agencies during the conduct of NSED
- Teachers lack of first-aid knowledge.

General Recommendations

Based on the evaluation submitted from our district offices, here are the following recommendations:

- All schools should regularly check their disaster preparedness equipment;
- One of the requirements for the school year end report;
- All government agencies shall participate in the conduct of the said activity;
- DepEd institutionalized this program and should be allocated budget for the implementation of this school activity. It should have communication device for the DRRM and SDRRM coordinators for the next implementation for communication purposes especially in the remote areas. And it is also useful in real situation in case of calamities that might possibly hit in the school.
- Mass training of all deped teaching & non- teaching personnel including students, pupils, parents and stakeholders.
- There should be an actual presentation to the pupils on how to rescue person injured during earthquake.


