Unable to spell the word correctly	To address the problem, the following solutions were recommended: 1. Students were asked to prioritize or focus on their studies 2. Teachers should provide varied activities to enhance the spelling ability, grammar, syntax, vocabulary and the use of cellphones inside the classroom should be prohibited. 3. Parents and children should have quality time viewing television and dining together for lunch/dinner during week days. 4.
