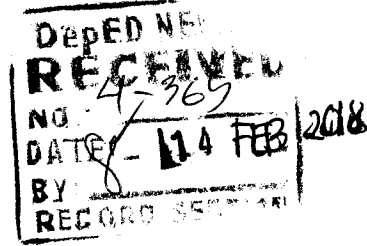

We are glad to inform you that through our efforts, we have provided social and financial education to more than **938 children** in the Division. The latest activity we have conducted was the Youth Entrepreneurship Training which provided a fun, engaging, and inspiring venue for children to develop their entrepreneurial mindset.
