

L Rationale:

Most of the Muslim teachers or asatidz teaching Arabic Language and Islamic Values (ALIVE) are not full-fledged teachers. Some are under graduates in college while others are only high school completers. However, there are a few of them who are ATEP (Accelerated Teacher Education Program) graduates who spent only twenty four (24) months in their college education. There may be Education graduates among them, but quite few only, and are LET passers.

It has been observed that the only significant aspect that qualifies them to teach ALIVE is their knowledge in the Arabic language; but the knowledge, skills and attitude that they need to teach these subjects are what they lack. They are found to be incompetent in planning and facilitating a lesson, managing the classroom, employing positive discipline, using effective strategies and techniques, and other aspects of teaching. These deficiencies result to lack of confidence in themselves as teachers, ineffective teaching of Arabic Language and Islamic Values.

There is also a need to consistently re-orient or review the Asatidz on the ALIVE Program particularly on the Framework, Guidelines, issues and concern base on researches and studies on implementation throughout the country.

II. Goal

Increase the academic performance of the students in the Arabic Language and Islamic Values (ALIVE)

III. Purpose

Improve the implementation of the ALIVE Program in the implementing schools of the Division Enhance the capabilities of the Muslim teaching ALIVE Increase the dynamism of the Muslim teachers in teaching ALIVE

At the end of the training workshop, 100% of the participants shall have:

- Gather MEP data and Musabagah Planning
- explained the different aspects of effective and successful teaching;
- enumerated the factors considered in establishing good classroom management;
- discussed the guidelines, legal bases and other aspects relevant in implementing positive discipline in the classroom;
- discussed all the aspects of a functional implementation of the ALIVE Program (ALIVE Framework & Guidelines)
- explained the importance of improving one's knowledge, skills and attitude necessary in teaching:
- expressed willingness to implement fully and effectively the ALIVE Program.
