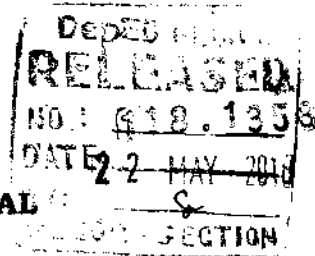

3. Traveling expenses shall be charged to MOOE/Local Funds subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

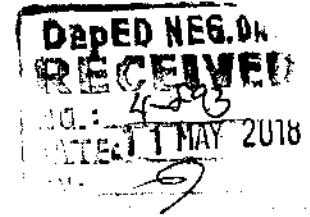

Greetings!

To recall, there was a pooling of efforts of the major stakeholders in each Province in this region in order to come up with a plan in one accord for the protection and best services for children. With the direction of our new administration, there is a need to know the prevailing situation of our community through revisiting the Local Development Plan for Children (LDPC) of 2005–2025 as one of the gifts for children.
