



Dear Dr. Bongalos,

Adolescence (aged 10-19 years old) is one of the most important stages in a person's life. Over the past years, the country faced with adolescent health issues, such as: teenage pregnancy, sexually transmitted infections, and HIV and AIDS. And, one of the important steps in order to show the importance of the adolescents is to ensure they are provided with correct health information by health service providers.

Addressing these problems is a big challenge to these health service providers. Thus, to capacitate them with enough knowledge and skills in dealing with adolescents, the Department of Health-Region7 and the Provincial Health Office-Negros Oriental will conduct a 3rd batch of Training on Healthy Young Ones (HYO) and Adolescent Health Education and Practical Training (A.D.E.P.T.).

This training uses a Healthy Young Ones Tarpaulins with the following topics: puberty, reproductive system, menstruation, gender and health, reproduction and responsibility, sexually transmitted infections, and HIV and AIDS. The tarpaulin offers a wealth of Adolescent Sexual Reproductive Health (ASRH) information to pave the way for desirable behavioral changes and development of critical life skills among adolescents towards the improvement of their health and well-being.

Considering that majority of the adolescents are in-school, we would like to invite 23 of your DepEd nurses (those who were not able to join the 2nd batch) to attend the above orientation on July 10-12, 2018 at Plaza Maria Luisa Suites Inn, Dumaguete City. Meals and accommodation will be provided, while traveling expenses, allowable per diems and other incidental expenses of the participants shall be shouldered by the sending agency. Each participant is advised to bring a laptop and a headset.

Furthermore, may we request that Negros Oriental High School (NOHS) be the venue during the practicum scheduled on July 12, 2018 from 8:30am-10:00am. During the practicum, the trainingparticipants will have the chance to apply their learnings through a conduct of information session to 50 selected Grade 7 students of your preference, which will be divided into two equal groups.
